Threat Assessment and Risk Management Workshop

Not only will you learn about general principles of threat assessment and risk management, but also about best practices supported by researchers and practitioners around the world. Successful completion will be recognized with a certificate.

Build your expertise when making decisions about cases that involve violence risk and develop your skills when communicating with others about these cases.

Implement best practices

Learn about best practices in assessing and managing violence risk that will help you to prevent future harm and protect you from liability.

Strengthen your relationships with other professionals with a shared interest in and responsibility for violence threat assessment and risk management.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

This course is relevant for professionals who want to obtain skills in threat assessment and risk management, including those working in criminal justice, security, health care, social service, education, and human resources settings.

Attendees of the Advanced Track should have completed Foundational Training (4 days or more) in threat assessment and risk management, including the use of structured professional judgment guidelines (e.g., HCR-20, SARA, SAM, SVR-20).

WORKSHOP INSTRUCTORS

The workshop instructors are internationally recognized experts, prolific authors, and engaging presenters. They are passionate about providing evidence-based knowledge and skills about threat assessment and risk management that professionals can apply in practice.

- Learn to administer the Guidelines for Stalking Assessment and Management (SAM)

Day 5

Assessing and managing risk for workplace and school violence

- Discuss critical issues in risk for workplace and school violence
- Learn how structured professional judgment instruments apply to workplace setting and education institutions

Day 1

Psychopathic personality disorder

- Learn to identify key symptoms of psychopathic personality disorder
- Discuss the relevance of psychopathic personality disorder in threat assessment

(e.g., interviewing strategies) and risk management (e.g., monitoring and supervision strategies)

Day 2

Assessing and managing risk for sexual violence

- Discuss critical issues in risk for sexual violence
- Learn to administer the Risk for Sexual Violence Protocol (RSVP)

Day 3

Assessing and managing risk for honour based violence

- Discuss critical issues in risk for honour based violence
- Learn to administer the PATRIARCH

Day 4

Assessing and managing risk for elder abuse

- Discuss critical issues in risk for elder abuse
- Learn to administer the Elder Abuse Risk Assessment (EARA)

Day 5

Assessing and managing group violence

- Discuss critical issues in risk for group violence
- (e.g., youth gangs, aboriginal gangs, criminal organizations, terrorist organizations)
- Learn to administer the Multilevel Guidelines (MLG)
