SPEAKER BIOS

Dr. Reid Meloy Ph.D.

Dr. Meloy is a board-certified forensic psychologist and clinical professor of psychiatry at University of California, San Diego, School of Medicine, faculty member of the San Diego Psychoanalytic Center, and Fellow of the American Academy of Forensic Sciences. Dr. Meloy consults on criminal and civil cases throughout the U.S. and Europe and has authored or co-authored over two hundred science papers and eleven books. Dr. Meloy has been a consultant to the FBI Behavioral Analysis Units at Quantico for the past 13 years, and is a member of the Fixated Research Group for the United Kingdom's Home Office. He is the co-editor of the International Handbook of Threat Assessment (Oxford Univ. Press, 2014), and senior editor of the Journal of Threat Assessment and Management.

Dr. Kris Mohandie Ph.D.

Dr. Kris Mohandie is a clinical, police, and forensic psychologist with extensive experience in the assessment and management of violent behavior. He is Board Certified by the American Board of Professional Psychology in Police and Public Safety Psychology. Dr. Mohandie developed a model school violence threat management program and regularly consults to college/university and K-12 schools, as well as workplace violence, extreme violence, stalking, and threat cases in the private and public sector. He has conducted extensive reviews of incidents of school violence, and is author or co-author of several papers on school violence, terrorism, threat assessment and stalking published in peer-reviewed psychiatric and psychological journals and is author of School Violence Threat Management: A Practical Guide for Educators, Mental Health and Law Enforcement.

OPP - Provincial Operations Intelligence Bureau: Covert Internet Intelligence Unit

Social Media and the Internet is the preferred medium for communication and the transfer of digital data by the general public including the criminal element. It is an ever-increasing area of expertise and important investigative tool for law enforcement. Social media and the Internet can assist in the early detection and intervention of those individuals who may be considering mass casualty events through available techniques over the Internet.

Unit Chief André Simons (FBI)

André Simons is a Supervisory Special Agent assigned to the FBI's Behavioral Analysis Unit (BAU) in Quantico, Virginia. He is the Unit Chief for the BAU2, supervising the operations of the Behavioral Threat Assessment Center and the Cyber Behavioral Analysis Center. UC Simons specializes in matters involving threat assessment and targeted violence, including active shooters, campus attackers, school shooters, public figure stalking, workplace violence, and the analysis of threatening communications. UC Simons is a co-author of the report Campus Attacks: Targeted Violence Affecting Institutions of Higher Education and recently served as the FBI's representative to the Defense Science Board's Task Force on Predicting Violent Behavior and is a Vice-President on the National Board of the Association of Threat Assessment Professionals (ATAP).

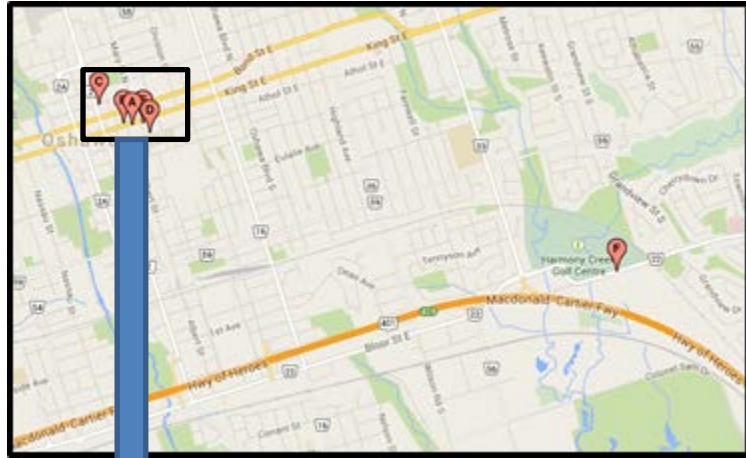

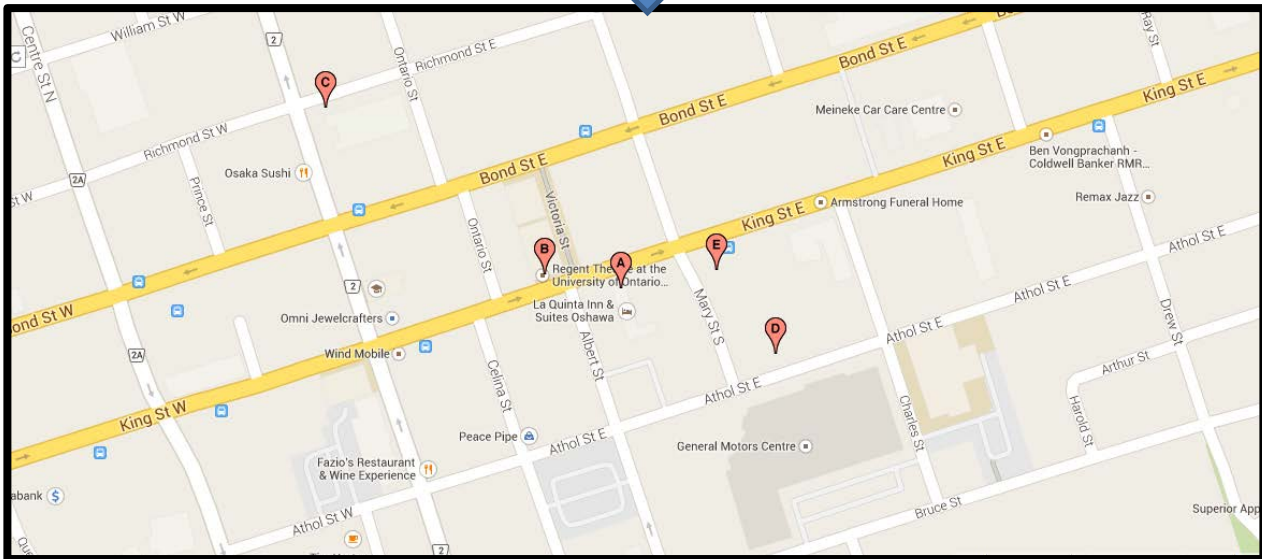
