





# Importance of "The Safe School Initiative"

- Incidents of targeted violence at schools rarely were sudden impulsive acts.
- Most attackers did not threaten their targets directly prior to advancing the attack.
- There was no useful or accurate "profile" of students who engaged in targeted school violence.

# Civilian Active Threat Response

## Virginia Tech - April 16, 2007

Perpetrator: 23 year old university student Background: Extreme social anxiety, selective

mutism, suicidal ideation

Duration: 10-12 minutes

Deceased: 32 (28 Students, 5 Faculty)

Survivors: 17 (Physically injured)

Resolution: Suicide

Weapons: Firearms (Carrying chains, knife)

## Considerations in Training for the Public

- ➤ Age & extent of prior safety training
- ➤ Mindful of our language and imagery > Tragedy, massacre
